





Cheers for 30 Years!

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2018 BRISTOL BAY SOCKEYE SALMON FORECAST

The world's greatest sockeye salmon fishery keeps getting bigger. Forecast numbers released by the Alaska Department of Fish Game predict another colossal sockeye salmon run in Bristol Bay, Alaska in 2018. A chart-topping total of 51.28 million sockeye salmon (range 40.68–61.88 million) are expected to return to Bristol Bay. This is 18% greater than the most recent 10-year average of Bristol Bay total runs (42.71 million) and 41% greater than the long-term mean of 33.78 million fish. All systems are expected to meet their spawning escapement goals.

The sockeye and other salmon represent a massive transfer of marine biomass from the Pacific Ocean into the boreal uplands of Bristol Bay. The salmon will contribute immense amounts of nitrogen to feed the plants. Did you know that trees that lining the waterways grow at a rate three-times higher than areas without spawning salmon? Every animal in the region benefits, including bears, wolves, eagles and more; every other animal specie that inhabit this one-of-a-kind ecosystem. And the good news for CCL guests is that the salmon biomass will also feed our legendary Rainbows, Grayling, Dolly Varden and Char.

TAKING A STAND FOR SALMON

For the better part of a decade, fishermen in Alaska and across the Lower 48 have been working to protect Bristol Bay, Alaska—one of the world's most important places for wild salmon and trout—from the threat of the proposed Pebble Mine. To date this effort has played out at the federal level. Recently the Environmental Protection Agency suspended its decision to advance Clean Water Act protections for Bristol Bay, while signaling that the Pebble Partnership should move forward with the permitting process. The permitting schedule is aggressive, and the mine could be federally permitted at record speed—posing a grave threat to the Bristol Bay fishery.

At this point it's clear: we can't rely on federal safeguards to protect the abundant wild fish runs we depend on in Alaska. It's time to pursue state-level protections for critical watersheds like Bristol Bay. The 60-year-old state law that currently governs permitting of development projects in Alaska's salmon habitat needs to be strengthened—to create clear habitat protection standards, provide greater public scrutiny for major development projects, and establish a limit on the amount of damage to salmon habitat that can be approved under state law. Such an update would ensure fish habitat isn't sacrificed as the state grows, and would expand protections for all salmon watersheds in Alaska—including Bristol Bay.

Stand for Salmon is a statewide campaign led by businesses, tribes, fishermen and conservation groups (including our friends at the Wild Salmon Center) working to strengthen Alaska law to ensure fisheries remain strong over the long term.
